**Education is Ceremony Scholarship:** In the same way that one can go through a traditional ceremony for purification, enlightenment, and healing, we see higher education as a modern-day ceremony offering the same rewards. Traditional ceremonies require and help grow one's discipline, patience, and gratitude; these same attributes are required and increased through the ceremony of education.

**Scholarship Award:** NHI will award \$2,000 for the 2024–2025 academic year. They award will be given in two payments, one \$1,000 payment per semester. The scholarship will be paid directly to you or your educational institution to cover tuition expenses.

- Undergraduate sophomore, junior or senior, Graduate or Professional student (post graduate, medical school)
- Pursuing a degree in higher education in a health related field in the 2024-2025 academic year
- Must be a full time student
- ✤ More than \$1,000 in unmet need for tuition for the 2024-2025 academic year

Additional preferences (not required) that we are looking for:

- Commitment to service: Active involvement in Indigenous culture, language, health, and advocacy
- Being a nontraditional student (Ex: 50 year old mother returning to school)
- Being from an Indigenous group restricted from many scholarship opportunities (ex: students from state-recognized and unrecognized tribes, students in the U.S. from Indigenous groups beyond U.S. such as Mayan and Aztec)
- Interest in serving Indigenous populations with the career/degree you are working toward
