


Native Health Initiative (NHI)

Executive Summary

Native Health Initiative (NHI) is committed to addressing health inequities in Indigenous communities through culturally relevant, community-driven programs. Over the past year, our organization has focused on advancing health equity by providing health promotion and preventative health programs that address the unique challenges that Indigenous communities face.

Our programs have provided preventive health services to over 1000 people through our Running Medicine program, almost 2000 people through our two major running events, and over 900 youth learned about the danger of commercial tobacco through our Breathe Tradition, Not Addiction program.

In 2024, we saw measurable success in increasing the resources that we put into health promotion programs. Our Healers of Tomorrow program is experiencing a 100% retention rate for the first time in it's history. This unique mentorship program educates Indigenous and other under-resourced youth about healthcare careers and how they can view their careers through a lens of health equity.

Looking forward, we are dedicated to further expanding our reach, continuing to empower Indigenous communities, and providing community driven solutions. Together with our partners, we aim to dismantle the barriers to health faced by Indigenous peoples and ensure they have the resources and support needed to thrive.

We thank our donors, volunteers, partners, and community members for their ongoing support and commitment to this important work. With your help, we are making strides toward a more equitable future for Indigenous communities.

RUNNING MEDICINE

Running Medicine (RM) is NHI's movement program that is grounded in the idea that movement is a potent medicine for mind, body, and spirit. Running Medicine was formed in 2016 by a group of people who saw the need for a low-cost, family-focused movement option in the Albuquerque area. We are still grounded in the original ideas, only charging \$20 for registration and incorporating movement for all ages and abilities. RM now has 5 different sites with two of them considered Partnership Programs (housed outside NHI but supported by our staff).



HEALERS OF TOMORROW



Healers of Tomorrow (HOT) is our 9-month mentorship program for high school students interested in pursuing health in their careers. Each student is paired with a mentor who is a health professional, or pursuing a health profession at the graduate level. Our program runs from September to May, and each month our students are exposed to many healthcare careers through guest speakers with lived experience and knowledge to share.

A core part of our programming, which inspired the vision for Native Health Initiative in our early days, was to be an organization aimed to teach aspiring young health professionals about the complex health inequities which Indigenous peoples face. We emphasize that health goes beyond being seen in the ER, or in the doctors office. Through HOT, each of our students have created their own unique community-based health project to improve at least one area of health in their chosen community. Throughout the years we have seen many students' creativity shine through as well as their passion for helping their communities.


